## Equity Survey 2006 Report

## Status of Paper

For information. This report presents the results of the BMC Equity Survey that was circulated in Summit 41 and went to $10 \%$ of the membership randomly selected. The return rate was $17 \%$ and that is fairly high for such a survey. The BMC was required to conduct the survey as part of the requirement to meet the Equality Standard.

## Commentary

In many ways the survey confirmed what we probably all suspect. For instance, almost half of those who replied were aged between 25 and 44 with less than one percent under 18 years of age. In terms of religion, again, almost half consider themselves to be Christian. While 44\% consider themselves to have no religion. Others represented were the Hindu, Buddhist and Jewish religions; but none from Muslim or Sikh religions.

In terms of the male/female split, this is now $72 \%$ male, $25 \%$ female ( $3 \%$ did not answer). Interestingly, this shows a 10\% difference from the previous survey in 2000 that recorded $82 \%$ male, $16 \%$ female.
$6 \%$ of people stated they have a disability of some kind. The largest percent recorded being a physical impairment of some kind. Again this has changed from the 2000 survey that shows this figure at $1.4 \%$.

Perhaps the most revealing figure relates to ethnic background. $98 \%$ of those surveyed being white with only $2 \%$ coming from all the other categories combined. And while all the other figures show change these figures are actually unchanged since the last survey.

The next step is to consider whether there are any barriers to participation that we can work towards removing. We will be seeking guidance on these matters in line with the Equity Standard that we are currently working towards achieving.
