BMC Hut Seminar 2015

Effective Management Workshop - John Scarborough

Important management issues were highlighted during the workshop, which can be summarised as follows:

- 1) Upgrading facilities to expand market/usage, and to meet increased user expectations (for example, to enable booking of individual rooms, or to provide shower facilities and wifi).
 - How to pay for this?
 - Loans/gifts from club members
 - Grants from Sport England
 - Increased subs/hut fees
- 2) Dealing with external dependencies and constraints.
 - Improving communication and relationships with planning authorities
 - Improving communication and relationships with landlords
 - VOA (Rateable value of huts) consistency and getting the best deal
 - Better awareness of legislation
 - Felt that the BMC needs to take more action as the Representative Body to collect and inform hut owners of relevant laws and changes
- 3) Increasing maintenance demands due to increased expectations and standards, H&S legislation and Child Protection legislation. Ways to manage this might include
 - Split responsibilities, e.g. Maintenance Officer, H&S Officer, Child Protection Officer
 - Clear definition of roles and responsibilities from the main Club Committee down to the Hut Management team
 - Increased use of local contractors and tradesmen
 - Effective maintenance scheduling
 - Upgrading to reduce maintenance load including use of failure sensing devices
 - Developing local contacts to act as paid caretakers and to undertake minor maintenance/cleaning
